Dear Students,

Welcome to Lakeview College of Nursing! On behalf of the Lakeview faculty, we would like to congratulate you on your acceptance into the program. As a graduation requirement during your time at Lakeview College of Nursing, 20 hours of service learning (community service) will need to be completed. This time will be completed throughout the curriculum and must be fulfilled to graduate.

The faculty would like to encourage you to take advantage of the numerous opportunities within the area to complete these hours.

A minimum five (5) hours are to be completed each semester, totaling twenty (20) hours by graduation. There is a multitude of organizations that seek out volunteers to serve the community. A list will be provided of places within the area that would serve as potential sites to complete these hours. All organizations require prior authorization to complete these hours, so it is imperative that as a student, you are proactive in getting these hours completed. Please contact the site before completing the hours to fulfill the site's needs.

At the time of registration each semester, the student must submit the Service-Learning a completed community service-learning form for hours completed that semester to your advisor. Students will complete a reflective journal in their final semester. The form must have a clearly readable signature of the contact person and their phone number. In addition, for agencies, proof of completed hours should be on provided agency letterhead with signature and contact information of the site. The advisor will then be able to scan the documents in the computer system to ensure that everyone meets the criteria by the time of graduation.

Below are suggested and pre-approved sites to complete service hours. However, students are allowed and encouraged to select other locations. If you wish to complete service hours at a location not on the list below, please contact your advisor for approval. All service hours should provide opportunities to meet the program outcomes outlined in the ServiceLearning Reflection Journal.
